 - (B) FLAK POSITIONS: Slight, inaccurate, heavy flak, red streaks observed before bursts as from rockets, at 1415 hours at 46 25 N 16 45 E at 15,000'. Moderate, accurate, heavy flak at 1250 hours at Vitkovice, Czechoslovakia at 22,900 feet. Slight, accurate, heavy flak at 1125 hours at 48 10 N 17 20 E at 20,000 feet. Slight, accurate, light flak at 1345 hours at 47 42 N 17 38 E at 14,000 feet.
