# INTELLIGENCE ANNEX "A" FOR OPERATIONS ORDER NO. 43, 12 MAY 1944

PLAN: Plan ABLE for 13 May 1944 is designed to further the plan of 12 May 1944 by attacking all points along the PIACENZA-EIMINI railroad line.

Included in this effort will be the breaking of the BRENNER line in the Alps. Great quantities of supplies and material are funneled into Italy on rail lines through the BRENNER PASS. Once in northern Italy, loaded rolling stock is shunted into one of several important rail centers where trains are marshalled together for consignment to the front lines over the bomb-battered rail system of central Italy where transportation is depending more and more on motor trucks.

A new target along the southern line is CESENA, which is southeast of FORLI. Reports are that CESENA is a transshipment point where supplies are changed from rail to truck transport forward to the front lines. Successful execution of this plan will contribute largely in the disorganizing of the forward troops.

Latest photo reconnaissance shows 85 wagons in the marshalling yards at CESENA with a goods train of about 50 wagons moving west in the direction of FORLI.

The FAENZA M/Y are shown as serviceable by latest reconnaissance photos. Plan ABLE for the 49th Wing is the destruction of M/Ys at CESENA and FAENZA.

### DEFENSES:

- (1) Flak: Latest reports available do not indicate an flak at CESENA or FAENZA.
- (2) Enemy fighters: No additions to yesterday's annex. In the immediate target area 50-60 planes have been observed in the FORLI, BOLOGNA and FERRARA area. They are included in the totals set out in yesterday's annex (12 May 1944).

FAENZA: T. C. No. 4-82-NA and photos coverage

CESENA: Photo coverage.

(Note) Emphasize that all units refrain from attacking  $\underline{FLORENCE}$  and RIMINI.

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
