WEATHER ANNEX.

SYNOPTIC SITUATION 0700Z.

Depression over Scandinavia with occlusion from center through central Poland and northern Balkans trailing into northern Italy. Weak surface low over Gulf of Genoa filling slowly. Small cell of Azores high over Bay of Biscay, with rain cell northeast of Azores.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Upper Winds: 5000' 320 degrees 15 knots.

10000' 310 degrees 20 knots.

15000' 300 degrees 30 knots.

ROUTE: Sky : Scattered stratocumulus in mountains over central Italy. Few low clouds over Corsica. Scattered middle and low clouds over south France.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 310 degrees 10000' 20 knots.

300 degrees 15000' 30 knots.

300 degrees 20000' 40 knots.

TARGET: Sky: 2/10 to 3/10 middle clouds. 1/10 to 2/10 low clouds.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Surface Wind: West to northwest at 5 to 10 mph.

Upper Winds: 20000' 300 degrees 40 knots.

25000' 300 degrees 45 knots.

RETURN: No change except diurnal cumulus over Corsica and central Italy. Few towering cumulus over Apennines. 3/10 to 5/10 cumulus at 6000' over bases.

ALTARNNTE FILLDS: All areas will remain open.

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
