WEATHER ANNEX.

SYNOFTIC SITUATION 1300Z

Low west of Scotland with warm front over North Sea and south across Holland, Belgium, and central France. Cold front across western England and trailing out over Lands End towards Azores. Typical flat pressure gradient with warm high aloft over Mediterranean.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Upper Winds: 5000' 350 degrees 20 knots.  
10000' 340 degrees 25 knots.  
15000' 340 degrees 30 knots.

ROUTE: Sky: Clear to Rimini, with scattered middle clouds north of Rimini becoming 3/10 to 5/10 in target area. 1/10 to 3/10 low clouds over land areas in eastern Po valley.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 10000' 3440 degrees 25 knots.  
15000' 330 degrees 30 knots.  
20000' 320 degrees 30 knots.

TARGET: Sky: 3/10 to 5/10 middle clouds, at 12,000'. 1/10 to 3/10 low clouds at 5,000'.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 miles.

Surface Winds: Northwest to North at 5 mph.

Upper Winds: 20000' 310 degrees 30 knots.  
25000' 310 degrees 30 knots.

RETURN: No change except for 2/10 to 3/10 cumulus over bases.

ALTERATE FIELDS: All fields will remain open.

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
