OPERATIONS ORDER #114
WEATHER ANNEX:

SYNOPTIC SITUATION (0700Z)

Weak high pressure belt over Baltic Sea, Central Europe, north Balkans, with highest pressure over Austria, General area of low pressure with associated frontal system over British Isles and northern France moving southeast. Unstable air causing widespread precipitation over northern France, and northern Germany.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Clear with scattered high clouds.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 miles.

Upper Winds: 5,000' 330 degrees 15 knots.
10,000' 330 degrees 20 knots.
15,000' 320 degrees 25 knots.

ROUTE: Sky: Generally clear from base to Yugoslavian coast with scattered high clouds at 22,000'. 3 to 5/10 cumulus, tops 10,000', bases 5,000' over Yugoslav mountains. 2 to 3/10 cumulus, tops 8,000', bases 5,000' and 3/10 middle, tops 12,000', bases 9,000' East of Yugoslav mountains.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 10,000' 330 degrees 20 knots.
15,000' 315 degrees 25 knots.
20,000' 315 degrees 30 knots.

TARGET: Sky: 2 to 3/10 cumulus, tops 8,000' base 5,000'. 3/10 middle clouds, tops 12,000' and bases at 9,000'. Scattered high clouds at 22,000'.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 20 miles.

Surface Winds: Light and variable,

Upper Winds: 20,000' 315 degrees 25 knots.
25,000! 315 degrees 30 knots.

RETURN: Same as route out with 5/10 high clouds and 3/10 cumulus over Italian mainland.

ALTERNATE FIELDS: All areas will remain open.

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
