OPERATIONS ORDER # 88.

WEATHER ANNEX:

SYNOPTIC SITUATION 0700Z.

Very flat pressure gradient over Mediterranean with small high over the Balkans. Warm front through Low Countries and central France will move east and give high clouds over target.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 miles or better.

Upper Winds: 5000' 270 degrees 5 to 10 knots.

10000' 280 degrees 20 knots.

15000' 270 degrees 25 knots.

ROUTE: Sky: Clear at start with few middle clouds in northern third of Adriatic. High clouds starting at same point and gradually increasing to north.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 10000' 280 degrees 20 knots.

15000' 270 degrees 30 knots.

20000' 260 degrees 35 knots.

TARGET: Sky: 1/10 to 2/10 middle cloud at 10,000'. 4/10 to 5/10 high cloud above 22,000'.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 miles.

Surface Wind: East to Southeast 5 mph.

Upper Winds; 20000' 260 degrees 35 knots.

25000' 260 degrees 40 knots.

RETURN: Clear over central and southern Adriatic with 5/10 to 6/10 cumulus at 7000' MSL over Base.

ALTERNATE FIELDS: All areas should be open.
