OPERATIONS ORDER # 89. WEATHER ANNEX:

SYNOPTIC SITUATION 0700Z.

Belt of high pressure from southern Russia across central Mediterranean. Complex low and associated frontal systems over North Sea will move slowly northeast. Small high cell forming over central Balkans.

## FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Broken cirrus above 20,000'. Otherwise clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 to 25 miles.

Upper Winds: 5000' 220 degrees 2 knots. 10000' 220 degrees 5 to 10 knots. 15000' 230 degrees 15 knots.

ROUTE: Sky: Cirrus decreasing to east becoming 1/10 to 2/10 over eastern Yugoslavia. Adriatic and Yugoslav coast clear 2/10 to 3/10 patchy stratus on eastern side of mountains in Yugoslavia, decreasing toward target.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Upper Winds: 10000' 230 degrees 15 knots. 15000'240 degrees 25 knots. 20000'250 degrees 35 knots.

TARGET: Sky: Few scattered cirrus above 25,000'. 1/10 to 2/10 low cloud. Otherwise clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 15 to 25 miles.

Surface Wind: Southeast but almost calm.

Upper Winds; 20000' 250 degrees 40 knots. 25000' 250 degrees 45 knots.

RETURN: No marked change except for scattered cumulus clouds at 8000' over bases and thickening of cirrus deck,

ALTERNATE FIELDS: All areas should remain open.
