WEATHER ANNEX:

SYNOPTIC SITUATION 1300Z.

Ridge of high pressure from south France through northern Balkans to the Ukraine is almost maintaining its intensity. Frontal system over England is moving rapidly east but is starting to turn northeast.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Clear.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Upper Winds: 5000' 030 degrees 10 knots.

10000' 040 degrees 10 to 15 knots.

15000' 330 degrees 05 knots.

ROUTE: SKY: Clear over Adriatic. Scattered low clouds in Yugoslav mountains increasing slightly to north. Scattered middle and high clouds base 10,000' starting north of Yugoslav mountains becoming 4/10 to 5/10 middle and 3/10 to 4/10 high clouds over Hungary.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Upper Winds: South of 44° N. North of 44° N.

10000' 020 deg. 10 knots.

15000' 300 deg. 05 knots 270 deg. 30 knots.

20000' 260 deg. 35 knots.

TARGET: Sky: 3/10 to 4/10 low clouds base 7000' and tops 9000'.
4/10 to 5/10 middle cloud. 3/10 to 4/10 high cloud
above 25,000'.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Surface Winds: Southwest at 10 to 15 mph.

Upper Winds: 20000' 260 degrees 35 knots.

25000' 260 degrees 40 knots.

RETURN: No change except for 4/10 to 6/10 diurnal cumulus with
base at 7000' on return.

ALTERNATE FIELDS: All areas should remain open.
