OPERATIONS ORDER # 95.

WEATHER ANNEX:

SYNOPTIC SITUATION 1300Z. Low centered between Sweden and Finland with occluded front through western Russia, Roumania and trailing into the Dinaric Alps. Secondary cold front across Baltic Sea, central Germany, and northeast France. High cell pushing in over northwest France. Trough of low pressure aloft in central Mediterranean causing clouds over Italy.

FORECAST:

BASE: Sky: Scattered cirrus above 20,000'. 2/10 to 3/10 middle clouds at 14,000'. 2/10 to 4/10 stratus at 5000' MSL.

Air-Ground Visibility. 15 to 20 miles.

Upper Winds: 5000' 340 degrees 15 knots.

10000' 330 degrees 25 knots.

15000' 310 degrees 25 knots.

ROUTE: Sky: Cirrus at base breaking to clear north of Ancona. Low clouds will continue over Adriatic, becoming 8/10 to 10/10 with towering cumulus over Yugoslavia. Middle clouds will continue becoming 8/10 or more over Yugoslavia, breaking somewhat north of the mountains.

Air-Ground Visibility: 10 to 15 miles.

Upper Winds: 10000' 330 degrees 25 knots.

15000' 310 degrees 30 knots.

20000' 300 degrees 35 knots.

TARGET: Sky: 7/10 to 9/10 low clouds with base at 2000' and tops to 10,000' to 12,000'. 4/10 to 5/10 middle cloud between 14,000' and 17,000'.

Air-Ground Visibility: 20 miles or better.

Surface Wind: North at 10 to 15 mph.

Upper Winds: 20,000' 300 degrees 35 knots.

25,000' 290 degrees 40 knots.

RETURN: Cumulus over the Alps built up above 15,000'. 4/10 to 6/10 cumulus at 6000' over bases.

ALTERNATE FIELDS: All areas should remain open, with Foggia best.
