Rickey B-17 Rebuild ???

Mike Rickey reports that he is slowly accumulating original parts from his B-17, which was shot down west of Kempten, Bavaria on the ill fated Memmingen Raid of 18 July 1944. For the past 18 months he has engaged in E-mail correspondence and telephone calls with Ludwig Hauber, an amateur "battlefield archaeologist", who resides in Bad Tolz about halfway between Munich and the Austrian border. Ludwig's interesting hobby led him to devote considerable time to researching the Memmingen air battle and unearthing artifacts from crash sites of both 483rd bombers and Luftwaffe FW-190's and ME-109's shot down that day. Seen below are some parts in his personal home museum.



Ludwig located the actual crash site of Mike's aircraft and has mailed several packages to Mike with bits and pieces of that old warbird. The latest contained an engine valve stem in fair condition. He also has identified crash sites of other B-17s and Luftwaffe fighters lost on that raid and plotted their locations on topographical maps. In a previous article in our March 2006 issue, survivors were invited to communicate with Ludwig to tell their stories, and several did so. And now for the rest of the story! Last March, Ludwig



visited the Rickeys and spent a week with Addie & Mike at their winter home in Arizona. In his checked baggage, he brought another 40 pounds of artifacts from Rickey's downed aircraft. Included were 50 caliber shells with links, bomb fragment, bomb shackle, radio compass, starter assembly, oil hose, flak vest inserts, and assorted twisted pieces of aluminum. Also a metal fragment from a Messerschmitt 109-E. If this keeps up, Mike may soon have acquired enough pieces to rebuild his B-!7!

During his weeklong stay Mike and Ludwig toured the Pima Air Museum near Davis Monthan AFB at Tucson. The 390th Bomb Group of 8th AF has one building there, which has indisputably the finest and most complete display of B-17 activities in the world. They spent nearly one entire day at this single facility. Ludwig presented the Museum Director with photos of one of the 390th Aircraft that had crash landed in Switzerland during WW II. Then both were given special permission to go inside of the displayed aircraft, where Ludwig took over 200 photos of individual parts. He was like a kid in a candy store for this was the first time he had ever seen an intact B-17. His only prior experiences were limited to photos and engineering drawings gleaned from the internet, and of course those bits and pieces unearthed from crash sites.

Military veterans and next of kin of deceased former military members may now use this new online military personnel record system to request documents. Click on the REQUEST MILITARY RECORDS Button to START. Other individuals with a need for documents must still complete Standard Form 180, which can be downloaded from this website. The new web-based application is designed to expedite service by minimizing the record center's mailroom processing time.

Military Funeral Honors

Family Members of deceased military veterans can request special honors at the funeral of their loved ones. The Military Funeral Honors Program, which is available across the nation, provides honorably discharged veterans with a military send-off. The program provides at least two military members as an honor guard to fold and present the flag to the veteran's next of kin. Taps is also played, although it may be a CD recording if a live bugler is not available. The recently passed National Defense Act funds a partnership between military-based honors program providers and local veteran service organizations. The result is that a family request for both a firing detail and a color guard for the veteran can be

To arrange for these honors, family members should inform the funeral home director on their first visit. They should present the funeral home director with a copy of the veteran's DD Form 214 or other proof of service, as well as the veteran's name, date of birth and Social Security Number. Other needed information includes the deceased's branch of service, dates of service and any special military awards. Each branch of the services has their own version of the Honors program, and will be the first point of contact by the funeral director. 483rd By Law Changes

The Constitution and By Laws of the 483rd Bombardment Group Association require the following changes for the reasons stated below. The Board of Directors has unanimously approved these changes, and they will be presented to the General Membership for final consideration at our Business Meeting on 20 Oct 2007 at the Covington, KY Reunion.

 To confirm language approved by vote of the 483rd Board and General Membership at the Sep 2006 Washington, DC Reunion, to remove Inactive Members delinquent 5 years or more from the newsletter mail list.

2. To reflect the impact of modern technology in streamlining Board proceedings during the interim between reunions.
3. To recognize and amplify the increasing role of FRIENDS as vital to the continuity of the 483rd Association, by authorizing them to vote and hold office while assisting their elder VETERAN comrades in the conduct of our affairs.

The following summarizes proposed changes approved by the Board. A detailed handout with line-by-line changes will be made available at the Covington Reunion. 1. In Constitution, wherever the phrase Regular Members appears, it will be changed to read: Qualified Members. A Qualified Member is defined as either a FRJEND or VET-ERAN member.

In Constitution Article V, para 2, strike out the words: 30 days.

3. Throughout the By Laws references to original 483rd members will be changed to read Veteran Members; where applicable the phrase Qualified Members (both FRIENDS and VETERANS) will be substituted for existing language.

4. In By Laws, Sec I, para 4, ... Remove Inactive Members from newsletter mail list after 5 years delinquency.

5. In By Laws, Sec III, C, Add Parliamentarian as an Appointed Officer to insure meeting decorum.

 In By Laws, Sec III, D, Committees, correct existing by adding new para 3 stating: The President shall appoint a Reunion Selection Committee to plan...

 In By Laws, Sec IV, B. Add language authorizing Board Meetings to be conducted by E-Mail or telephone conference.
