High Lights

Crazy Horse

Crazy Horse Memorial, mankind's largest art project in progress (641 feet long and 563 feet high, carved in the round, with 219-foot high horse's head) is on U.S. Highway 16/385 between Hill City and Custer. Mount Rushmore National Memorial is just 17 miles from Crazy Horse.

Korczak, a noted New England sculptor, first came to the Black Hills in 1939 to help Gutzon Borglum on Mount Rushmore. Standing Bear read news reports of Korczak's artistic achievements and

ted him to create a mountainous tribute to the North American Indians.

After serving in the European theater during World War II, Korczak returned to the Black Hills to tackle Standing Bear's challenge. He started with chisels and hammers, doing back breaking work by hand. The first blast on the mountain was on June 3, 1948, dedicating a Memorial that South Dakota Gov. George T. Mickelson said "will serve to remind us of the debt we owe to these first Americans.'

Deadwood



The entire city of Deadwood is a national historic landmark. In Deadwood you can ponder the truth at the foot of Wild Bill's grave in Mount Moriah cemetery, tour the Adams Museum and House, pan for gold at the Broken Boot Mine, choose from various guided tours, or take a self-

On the 2 of January 1942, the U.S. War Department established Rapid City Army Air Base as a training location for B-17 Flying Fortress crews. From September 1942-when its military runways first

opened-until mission needs changed in July 1945, the field's instructors taught thousands of pilots, navigators, radio operators and gunners from nine heavy bombardment groups and numerous smaller units. All training focused on the Allied drive to overthrow the Axis powers in Europe.

- Need members with cameras to take pictures of events and attendees. 483rd will pay immediate developing costs.


President's Message
