#### Flying the "Liberty Belle"

My first flight on the B-17"Liberty Belle" was in March of 2010 out of Long Beach, CA Airport. She had been recently restored, or reconstructed, by the son of the tail gunner on

the original 8th Air Force Plane. I had a beautiful flight down the coast with the press. (I have had 4 freebies because of my antiquity).

My first post war flight was in an old F model in 1996 for which I paid \$300.00. They now pay 6 bucks per gallon.



The plane has been civilized, per FAA to carry passengers for over \$400 for a 45 minute flight. "Guests" have to be belted down for take-off and landings or on cushions in the

waist area. After take-off you can move about the plane but the tail gun position is blocked off and they nixed my request to fly in the ball turret (Sorry George, Ed.). I found out that getting down into the nose was more difficult than when I was 19. Last March 22nd "Liberty Belle" came to Bob Hope Airport in Burbank. I was again invited to go on a press flight, out over the Hollywood Hills and on to the Malibu Coast.

The" Liberty Belle" took off from Aurora, IL on June 13th to continue the tour to Indianapolis when a fire developed in the left wing. A turn back to the airport was deemed to dangerous and the pilot made a safe forced landing in a farm field. The crew attempted to fight the fire with the on-board extinguishers were unsuccessful.

A fire truck came form the airport but did not attempt to put out the fire. (The chickenfolks watched from the pavement as one of only 13 B-17s that are capable of flying - (Altogether 58 B-17s have survived and, as of June 2011, 13 airframes are currently in flying condition.) burned almost beyond repair. Ed). The "Liberty Belle" was a total loss.

The good news is that there was insurance on the plane and therefore a "new" one may be rebuilt. When I am 90, I may get another ride on the amazing "Liberty Belle."

# It's a bird, It's a plane... It's a grill!



A special project contest for 7 area high schools was offered to the students of the Engineering Club of Kohler High School in Kohler, Wisconsin. The project involved creating and

building a unique bratwurst grill. Project GRILL stands for Growing Readiness in Leading and Learning. 16 students under the direction of Dave DEBruin, the Technology Teacher accepted the offer.

The rules of the project were that it had to be made by the students, the grill had to be portable, the design had to represent both the school



and the sponsoring company, it had to cook at least one dozen brats at a time, and it was to use 20 pounds of charcoal with lighter fluid as the fuel. Because the school's sports teams are named the "Kohler Bombers", Mary Molepske and Jacob Hart suggested they make a B-17 fryer. Mary drew the plans and they were taken to Executive Keith Anderson and Zackery Giffey of the Curt Joa Manufacturing Company, a sponsor for the contest. The design submitted included a grill on a fold up wing, a storage area for the ice and refreshments in the fuselage and a means to transport the portable grill by means of landing gear appearing wheels.



After 2000 hours (400 hours in after school classroom study and 1600 hours in the factory learning the use of tools and materials) the project became a reality, The plane was

taken to Craig Schueffner Paint Shop to have the insignias and markings added. Art Winkler, a member of the 483rd Bombardment Group(H) in WWII enlightened the students with experiences and stories of his tour of duty on a B-17.

The community is proud of the students, the teachers, work

instructors and sponsors who; helped the students reach their goal. The B-17 grill was awarded first place at the outdoor trial event.



#### New Eligibility for Purple Heart Award

Do you qualify?



The Army will allow more battlefield concussions to be eligible for a Purple Heart, embracing the latest scientific findings that even brief periods of dizziness or headaches are evidence of the wound. The Army began reviewing how Purple Hearts are awarded for battlefield concussions last year in response to a story by NPR-ProPublica. The

decision to expand the definition for concussions will mean thousands of Purple Heart medals going to soldiers denied them in the past.

The new rules spell out precisely what constitutes a concussion, with symptoms such as any momentary loss of consciousness or memory, dizziness, headache, nausea or light sensitivity. Medical treatment, also required for the medal, is defined by the rules to include merely rest and Tylenol. Apart from the prestige of earning a Purple Heart, the award also entitles the recipient to priority enrollment for VA benefits, exempting them from co-pays for hospital and outpatient care.

Col. Tom Quinn of the Army office that oversees awards is urging soldiers who believe they were wrongly denied the award to seek a review of their case. "We think that some deserving soldiers may not have been appropriately recognized," says Quinn, urging soldiers to re-apply through their chain of command and veterans to call 888-276-9472 or hrc.tagd.awards@conus.army.mil.

#### Military Funeral Honors

Family Members of deceased military veterans can request special honors at the funeral of their loved ones. The *Military Funeral Honors Program*, which is available across the nation, provides honorably discharged veterans with a military send-off. The program provides at least two military members as an honor guard to fold and present the flag to the

veteran's next of kin. Taps is also played, although it may be a CD recording if a live bugler is not available. The recently passed *National Defense Act* funds a partnership between military-based honors program providers and local veteran service organizations. The result is that a family request for

both a firing detail and a color guard for the veteran can be

To arrange for these honors, family members should inform the funeral home director on their first visit. They should present the funeral home director with a copy of the veteran's DD Form 214 or other proof of service, as well as the veteran's name, date of birth and Social Security Number. Other needed information includes the deceased's branch of service, dates of service and any special military awards. Each branch of the services has their own version of the Honors program, and will be the first point of contact by the funeral director. For more information visit the national3

#### Kansas City Airport Transportation

The main airport for the Kansas City area is the Kansas City International Airport (MCI), which is approximately 23 miles from the Holiday Inn Country Club Plaza.

There are three ways to get to the Holiday Inn Country Club Plaza from the airport: Super Shuttle - The Super Shuttle Blue Vans are available at the curb outside the baggage claim area of the Airport. The costs are \$19.00 per person, \$31.00 round trip, if booked in advance. The shuttle service can be reached by calling 1-800-BlueVan. Super Shuttle customer service desks and kiosks are located near the baggage areas of all three terminals (A, B, and C) at the Kansas City Airport. After retrieving your bags in the baggage claim area, report to the Super Shuttle customer service desk, or, if after hours, the customer service courtesy phone, and they will arrange your shuttle pickup. You must checkin inside the airport before proceeding to the vans. Be sure to have your confirmation number, or confirmation receipt, when you get to the desk. This service does stop at other hotels along the way.

Super Shuttle Direct - You can also book a Super Shuttle Blue Van nonstop trip to the hotel. The cost is \$39.00 per person, \$64.00 round trip, if booked in advance. Please call 1-800-Blue Van and say that you want to book the nonstop express service. Then follow the same procedure listed above after retrieving you luggage in the baggage claim area. Taxi Service - Yellow Taxi is available at the airport. For taxi service, call 816-471-5000 when you get to Kansas City. One-way cab fare is @ \$60.00 depending on traffic. Remember, two people can share a cab and go directly to the hotel with no stops.
